Elizabeth Joachim to Head National Council of State Housing Boards

MHC's Board of Directors consists of 9 appointees. Six members are appointed by the governor, three are appointed by the Lieutenant Governor, and they represent the 3 Supreme Court Districts of the State.

The Mississippi Home Corporation was created by the State in 1989 to serve as the State's Housing Finance Agency. In that capacity, MHC administers the Mortgage Revenue Bond

program and the Housing Tax Credit program, among others. MHC's mission is to enhance Mississippi's long-term economic viability by financing safe, decent, affordable housing and helping working families build wealth.
